BEING PRO-LIFE IN CONNECTICUT IN A POST-ROE WORLD!

After 49 years of praying, working and hoping for the day when the worst U.S. Supreme Court decision in our nation's history would be overturned, after an unprecedented leak, it finally happened in our lifetimes on June 24, 2022 when the U.S. Supreme Court released its Dobbs v. Jackson Women's Health Organization decision overturning parts of Roe v. Wade by sending the abortion issue back to the states.

Though the Mississippi law was upheld by a vote of 6-3, the vote to partially overturn Roe v Wade and Casey v. Planned Parenthood was by a single vote, 5-4, with Chief Justice Roberts switching sides.

Note carefully, the Court did not outlaw abortion. The issue is now up to the states.

States, including Connecticut, are now free to ban abortion completely, or to allow abortion on demand throughout all nine months of pregnancy, which is the current law in Connecticut.

Most importantly, the Court did not overturn, nor even address, the most important legal finding in Roe – whether or not the unborn child is a Constitutional "person," with a guaranteed right to life.

While parental notification, defunding abortion, etc. are important issues which should be pursued during the 2023 session of the Connecticut General Assembly, the most important issue concerns the personhood of the unborn.

The personhood movement is strong and growing, with groups such as the national Personhood Alliance now having 28 state affiliates. We must get the U.S. Supreme Court to recognize the Constitutional personhood of every pre-born human being.

If the Court does not act, a Constitutional amendment needs to be proposed and ratified.

There are two ways to propose a Constitutional amendment - through Congress, or by calling a Constitutional Convention.

Congress could propose an amendment by two-thirds votes in both houses. The amendment would then need to be ratified by the legislatures, or conventions, in 38 states.

If Congress fails to act, Congress can be bypassed by working through the states to call for a Constitutional Convention. Two-thirds, or 34, states are needed to call for convening a Constitutional Convention. In the late 1970's and early 1980's about 30 states issued calls for a Constitutional Convention concerning a pro-life amendment. If those Convention calls are still valid, only four more states are needed to call for a convention to propose an amendment.

We must begin, here in Connecticut, to educate the public and our legislators about the scientific fact that the life of each and every human being begins at fertilization, or cloning, and that every human being, at every stage of its biological development, is a person, with a right to life.

CONNECTICUT GENERAL ASSEMBLY

With Roe now partially overturned, any legislation concerning limiting abortion is possible. The outcome of the elections in November for governor and state legislators will determine what legislation is feasible in the 2023 session of the General Assembly. Republican candidate for governor Bob Stefanowski says he would be supportive of a parental notification bill while Governor Ned Lamont says he would not be.

2022 ELECTIONS

This year Election Day is on Tuesday, November 8.

Democrat Richard Blumenthal is running for reelection against Republican Leora Levy for the U.S. Senate.

The positions of governor, lieutenant governor, attorney general, secretary of state, treasurer and comptroller will also be on the ballot.

Elections will also be held for the five House seats in Congress, and for the state senators and state representatives to the Connecticut General Assembly in Hartford.

2023 MARCH FOR LIFE – WASHINGTON, D.C.

The 2023 March for Life activities will take place on Thursday and Friday, January 19 and 20, to mark the 50th anniversary of the U.S. Supreme Court's Roe v. Wade abortion decision and to celebrate its being partially overturned.

The March for Life is the largest annual pro-life gathering in the world.

The March for Life Expo/Convention, which features a multitude of the nation's pro-life leaders, exhibit booths and much more, will be held at the Renaissance DC Downtown Hotel on Thursday the 19th and Friday the 20th – times to be announced.

On Friday the 20th the March for Life Pre-Rally Concert begins at 11 AM on the National Mall and the March for Life Rally will follow from Noon to 1 PM. After the Rally, the March for Life will begin from the Mall at 1 PM, ending between the U.S. Capital and the U.S. Supreme Court.

Following the March, from 6 to 9 PM, the annual Rose Dinner will be held at the Renaissance DC Downtown Hotel. Registration opens in September. Reserve your tickets early - the event has sold out in recent years. Speakers to be announced.

The Renaissance DC Downtown Hotel is the host hotel for the March for Life. Group reservations for five or more rooms begins in September. Individual registration opens in October.
